INFORMATION ABOUT KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

The online process to register your child in Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools has begun.

The following information will help determine if this process will apply to you. If your answer is yes to any of the following questions, you will register through the new online registration process:

- Is my child new to Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools?
- Do I have a child that will be turning five years old on or before December 31, 2018?
- Do I want to register my child in French Immersion?
- Do I want to register my child in Late French Immersion?
- Do I want to register my child in secondary academies? (Hockey, Soccer, Beach Volleyball, Lacrosse, Baseball, Performing Arts or Jazz)
- Do I want to apply for a school transfer request (out-of-catchment)?

Before you begin, you will need the following:

- 1. A valid email address
- Photo or scan showing proof of citizenship (ie. Birth certificate)
- Photo or scan showing proof of Canadian residency (ie. Mortgage or bank statement, utility bill, driver's license, etc.)

Online registration is now open.

New Academy, Out-of-Catchment and Out of District student registrations will be prioritized by date and time submitted online. Deadline was **March 31**, **2018**.

CLASS PLACEMENT FOR 2018-2019

It is that time of year again when we begin to look at our needs for staffing of projected classes for the 2018-19 school year. Our anticipated student population for next year is significantly higher than this year with the closure of Rutherford Elementary. How classes are organized will depend on overall numbers as well as the numbers at each grade level. Therefore, it is very important to notify the school if your child(ren) will not be returning to Frank Ney next year.

Actual assignment of students to classes does not occur until the end of June or beginning of September, but it is not too early to remind parents that student placement is contingent upon a number of factors. The decision



for placement is based primarily on the recommendation of the child's present teacher, the person most familiar with his/her educational needs. In arranging classes, we endeavour to achieve an optimal class composition by balancing such factors as ability, work habits, behaviour, learning styles, teaching styles, previous placements, gender, contractual obligations, and other social factors.

The process for parent input is as follows:

a) Parents are encouraged to communicate throughout the year with their child's classroom teacher. If parents are concerned about a particular educational issue for their child in the upcoming year, they are encouraged to speak with their child's current teacher as an advocate for their child.

b) Following a discussion with the teacher, parents may put their educational concerns in writing to the principal by Friday, June 15th, 2018 of the current school year.

c) Letters should focus on specific needs of the child, please do not make requests for placement with specific teachers. Parents need to realize that the process is a complex one and individual requests cannot always be met. **Please note**, **letters will be shared with the staff**.

Please note, we will take some time the first week of school in September to get to know all our students, current and new to Frank Ney. We will then work diligently as a joint staff to make our final placement decisions.

SCHOOL DRESS CODE

As the weather becomes warmer, lighter clothing will be worn at school. Please take a moment to review the important dress code our District and School have in place.



Students will dress in an appropriate manner that is conducive to a positive and safe learning environment. Appropriate dress is:

- ≻ safe
- free of any reference to alcohol, drugs, gangs, hate, obscenity, profanity, discrimination or violence
- > not disturbing or distracting to others
- not displaying excessive amounts of skin no halter tops, spaghetti straps, tube tops or backless tops

Students arriving to school inappropriately dressed will be asked to phone home and change. Thank you for ensuring your child comes to school dressed accordingly.
