Student's Wheeled Transportation



With the welcoming back of the sunlight and warm weather, we are happy to see students coming to school on wheeled items (bikes, scooters, skateboards, etc.). These items

encourage physical activity which is incredibly important for our students.

Given the number of students at our school, we ask that students walk (bikes, scooters, skateboards) and remove (rollerblades and roller skates) once they arrive on the school site. They become a safety concern with so many bodies. If your child is coming to school with wheeled transportation, please continue to encourage the use of these "green" transportation items and remind them of the safe practices around them. We will also remind them on our end. We also ask that our students be mindful and respectful of people using the public walkway that separates our school from Harry Wipper park. Please remind your child to "create adequate room" and/or dismount when approaching people who are walking on the pathways/trails.

Student Learning Survey

Registration

The online process to register your child in Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools began in January. This process is for (a) all new kindergarten students, (b) families new to the district, and (c) students changing schools.

Before you begin, you will need the following:

- 1. A valid email address.
- 2. Photo or scan showing proof of citizenship (ie. Birth certificate)
- Photo or scan showing proof of Canadian residency (ie. mortgage or bank statement, utility bill, driver's license, etc.)

An important Enrolment date to remember is June 15. Applications for enrolment (through the district's E-Registration) must be received by that date to ensure a student's placement in their catchment-area school.
